

Michael Stanley introduces Detective Kubu

Second Detective Kubu mystery set for release

On April 14 in Knysna, South Africa, we will have the worldwide launch of Detective Kubu's second investigation, *A DEADLY TRADE*. Two months later, on June 2, HarperCollins will release their hardcover in North America at Once Upon A Crime in Minneapolis, Minnesota. However it will have a different title – *THE SECOND DEATH OF GOODLUCK TINUBU*. Finally, Headline will release the hardcover of *A DEADLY TRADE* in the UK on June 11.

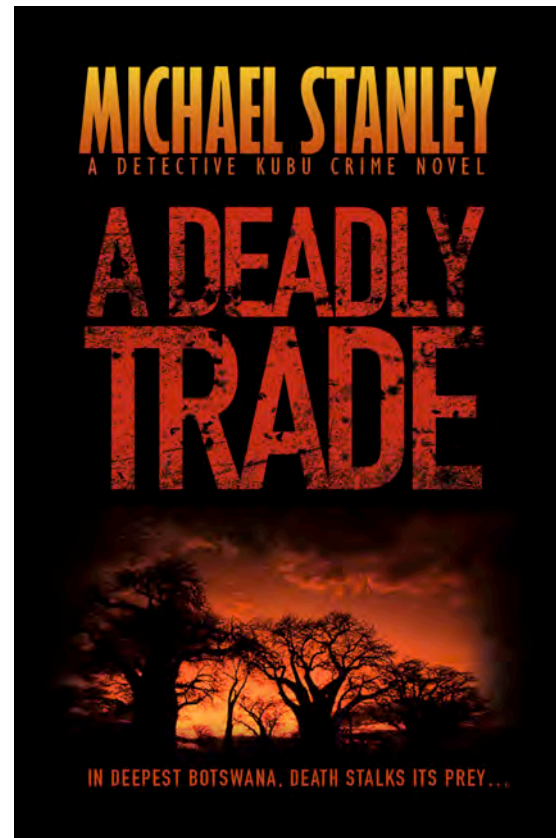
The book is set in a very different part of Botswana from *A CARRION DEATH*'s arid southern regions. Jackalberry Camp, where most of the action takes place, is set in the lush riverine forests of the Linyanti River, which separates Botswana and the Caprivi Strip of Namibia.

The back story of the book is the turmoil in Zimbabwe and how people who fought for their freedom in the Rhodesian Civil War 30 years ago now find themselves without that freedom. Like all wars, the Rhodesian bush war forged strange relationships, both good and evil. This story, set in present day Botswana, is about the dissolution of two such bonds.

Finalist in the Minnesota Book Awards

A CARRION DEATH is a finalist in the genre fiction of the Minnesota Book Awards. The jury will decide between John Sandford's *Phantom Prey*, William Kent Kruger's *Red Knife*, Julie Kramer's *Stalking Susan*, and *A CARRION DEATH*. The winner will be announced at the Awards Dinner on April 25, in St. Paul, Minnesota. Hopefully the snow will have melted.

Detective Kuba in Bad Company

Bad Company is a collection of 17 mystery short stories by South African authors. The book includes top crime writers like Deon Meyer, Mike Nicol and Margie Orford, as well as several novelists who are trying out this genre. The stories range from the urban sprawl of Johannesburg to rural Botswana. Lee Child wrote an introduction for the book and commented: "They told me there were gold mines in South Africa – and look what just came out."

Kubu features in the story "Neighbors," but the context is quite different from the mysteries in our two novels. This story takes place in the small rural village of Gabane. Two neighbours engage in an escalating quarrel, and one dies suddenly of unknown causes. The police are puzzled, but the villagers are certain that witchcraft is behind the death. Kubu and pathologist Ian MacGregor have to act quickly to resolve the mystery and stop the situation getting out of hand.

More than a hundred mystery lovers attended the launch at the Book Lounge in Cape Town on March 20, which was delightfully
